



Charles M. Luebbecke

September 4, 1930 - January 23, 2010

Charles Marion Luebbecke died on Saturday, January 23, 2010 at the University of Maryland Medical Center. He was 79.

Born in St. Michaels on September 4, 1930, he was the son of the late, George W. and Viva Caulk Luebbecke. He graduated from St. Michaels High School in 1949 and then moved to Baltimore for several years to learn the upholstery trade. During this time, he joined the National Guard, serving for ten years in the 115th Infantry Division. Upon his return to St. Michaels, he worked at Hubbard's Dry Cleaners, as the Maintenance Manager for the Town of St. Michaels, and at the Easton Airport before finally finding his career. He spent the next 30 years working as an electrician, first in the partnership of Luebbecke Electric, and then as sole proprietor of CL Electric.

Mr. Luebbecke served on the St. Michaels Historical Commission. After retiring in 1990, he donated his time to Habitat for Humanity, wiring many homes. He loved working with wood, creating beautiful furniture. He also had a love of nature, with a special appreciation for trees, and of gardening, growing beautiful flowers and a huge vegetable garden every year.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 58 years, the former Ruth Millicent Marshall; a son, Hans Luebbecke and his wife, Brenda, of Preston; a daughter, Milly Luebbecke Wroten and her husband, Billy, of St. Michaels; three grandchildren: Nathan Wroten, Haley Wroten, and Tiffany Luebbecke; and several nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, Ellsworth Luebbecke, his sister, Louise Luebbecke Stewart, and his best friend "Max", a white Sheppard/Husky mix.

A memorial service will be held at 2:00 pm on Sunday, January 31, 2010 at the Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Easton, where friends may call one hour prior.

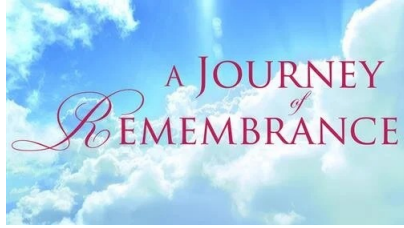
