



Charles G. Sadler

January 9, 1919 - January 5, 2010

Charles Gustin Sadler, Sr., of Tilghman, died at the Memorial Hospital in Easton on January 5, 2010. He was 90 years of age.

Born in Tilghman, January 9, 1919, he was the son of the late, Gustav and Roby Louise Lednum Sadler. After attending public school, he worked on the water until serving in the U.S. Army from 1941 until 1945. Following his release from active duty, he returned to Tilghman where he worked on the water until 1960, when he became station manager for the U.S. Government at their Naval Research Station at Tilghman. Following his retirement from that position in 1980, he again worked on the water until 1997.

A lifelong resident of Tilghman, he was a member of the Dorchester Post #91, American Legion, Cambridge and the Easton Elks Lodge #1622.

Mr. Sadler is survived by his wife, the former Cornelia Sinclair, whom he married on December 15, 1950 on Tilghman, and two brothers, Leroy D. Sadler and Frederick K. Sadler, both of Tilghman. A son, Charles G. Sadler, Jr., died in 1973.

Funeral services will be held at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 12, 2010 at the Tilghman United Methodist Church, where friends may call one hour prior to the service.

Burial will be in the Tilghman Memorial Cemetery.
