Charles W. “Chuck” Carroll died at his home in Easton, MD on Saturday, June 14, 2008. He was 79.

Born June 16, 1928 in Trappe, MD, he was the son of the late Charles and Helen V. Hummer Carroll. After attending Talbot County Public Schools, he served in the U.S. Navy in the Pacific Theatre during World War II. He then began a lifelong career in the banking industry, working for Union Trust in the Talbot, Dorchester and Caroline banking region, retiring in 1988 as Vice President.
