



## Charlie Mae Brown

November 18, 1929 - November 29, 2011

Charlie Mae Brown of Stevensville, MD, died on November 29, 2011, at Mandrin Care Center in Harwood. She was 82.

Born in Swanannoa, NC, on November 18, 1929, she was one of six children of the late Ben L. and Geneva Hill Edwards. She grew up in North Carolina where she attended school. Charlie moved to Maryland to reside with family, where she later met and married Carol "Curley" Brown. They lived in Annapolis until the late 1960s, when they moved to Stevensville. She worked for Bowen's Farm Supply in Annapolis and also as a waitress for Pier One Restaurant and Kentmoor Restaurant in Stevensville. Retiring in 1992, Charlie enjoyed gardening, ceramics, spending time with her grandchildren and pets, and cheering for her favorite team, the Redskins.
