



Charlotte F. Bishop

November 5, 1927 - February 15, 2015

Charlotte Franzen Bishop of Chester, MD, died on February 15, 2015, at Heritage Harbour Health and Rehabilitation Center in Annapolis, MD. She was 87.

Born in Philadelphia, PA, the daughter of the late Martin and Elin Franzen, she graduated from Blair High School, Class of 1946. Then she received her Bachelor of Music from the Peabody Conservatory in 1950. On December 17, 1949, she married Neil David Bishop of Milwaukee, WI.

Mrs. Bishop taught music from her home and was a homemaker. The couple lived in Baltimore until 1953 when they moved to Silver Spring. In July 1978, they moved to Stevensville, MD. Mrs. Bishop was a member of Prospect Bay County Club, Grasonville and Kent Island United Methodist Church.

Charlotte is survived by her two sons, Jeffrey Neil Bishop and his wife Ann Marie of Chester, MD and Martin Bishop of Stevensville, MD; grandchildren, Shawn Bishop of Chester, MD, and Kelly Bishop Johnson of Chester, MD. She was predeceased by her husband, Neil David Bishop.
