July 11, 1944 - July 7, 2016

Charlotte Meyer Fryling of Arlington, VA, and Easton, MD, died July 7, 2016, from complications of Multiple Sclerosis.

She was born July 11, 1944 in Richmond, VA, to the late Charles and Ruth Ronken Meyer of Olney, MD. She graduated from Sherwood High School in 1962 and Western Maryland College in 1966 with a degree in Biology. She worked for many years as a biologist for the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD.

Charlotte married John Fryling in 1978. They resided in Arlington, VA, for many years and summered frequently at their home in Bethany, DE. They sailed together the length of the Atlantic Coast, the Caribbean, and the Chesapeake Bay in their Hinckley Bermuda-40 Yawl Wolverine. They also enjoyed skiing and traveling. In 1999, they moved their sailboat and retired to their home in Easton, MD, on Peachblossom Creek.

Charlotte was preceded in death by her husband, John, in February 2011. She is survived by two sisters, Janice Paul of Warminster, PA, and Marilyn Brewer of Silver Spring, MD, and numerous nieces and nephews.
