January 20, 1964 - September 17, 2025

Chris Novak of Chester, Maryland died at home on Wednesday, September 17, 2025. He was 61.

Chris was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania on January 20, 1964, to Tom and Shirleyan Novak. He grew up in the Pines on the Severn of Arnold, Maryland with his older brother, Ken, and his younger brother, Tom. He graduated from Severna Park High School in 1982. 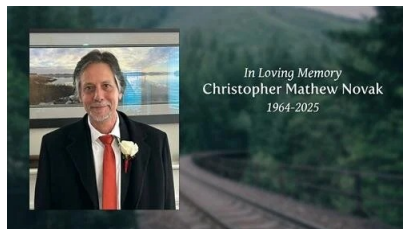
