



Clara Schlotzhauer

February 5, 1923 - May 31, 2011

Clara C. Schlotzhauer, age 88, passed away peacefully on May 31, 2011, in her home in Cordova.

She was a life-long resident of Talbot County and the Cordova area. Born on a farm near Newtown on February 5, 1923, she was the daughter of the late, Joseph Raymond and Alphonso Estelle Golt Callahan. She completed her elementary grades in the one-room school-house at Longwoods, attended and graduated from Cordova High School at the age of 16, the youngest member of her class, in 1939. In 1943 she completed a course as a Army Air Force Aircraft Recognition Officer, taught classes in Longwoods School, and worked as a Grounds Observer. She worked in the McCrory's 5 & 10 and Atkinson's Dress Store in Easton. She married Chris Robert Schlotzhauer, Jr. on March 31, 1948, who passed away on April 16, 1974. They worked side-by-side with their children for many years, on the family's dairy and grain farm, raising and milking Golden Guernsey dairy cows. She was a homemaker and talented seamstress.

Mrs. Schlotzhauer was member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, served as the secretary of the Cordova High School Alumni Assoc. for 23 years, was an Honorary Life Member of the Cordova PTA, serving as President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, was an Honorary Life Member of the MD

Congress of Parents and Teachers, Inc., a 1964 Candidate in the Talbot County Queen of Hearts Contest, in which she appeared on WBAL-TV, a Life Member of the Food Service Assoc., a past Vice President of the Talbot County Farm Bureau Women's Committee, and served on the Board of Directors of the Talbot Agricultural Center. She retired from the Talbot County Board of Education in 1997, at the age of 75. She volunteered for many years as a Judge for the Talbot County 4-H Fair, and Waterfowl Festival. She enjoyed playing cards with her friends, baseball, harness racing, and spending time with her family.

She is survived by her children, Mary Ann Shortall, and her husband, Purnell, James R. Schlotzhauer, and his wife, JoAnn, Sharon C. Neuwiller, and her husband, Chuck, Chris R. Schlotzhauer, and his wife, Carol, and Mickey J. Chance, and her husband, Randy; her grandchildren, Shannon Stafford, and her husband, Andrew, Jim Schlotzhauer, and his wife, Sandy, C.R.
