January 19, 1955 - December 21, 2011

Clara Ethel Thompson, known to most as “Clare,” passed away peacefully in her Denton home on Wednesday, December 21, 2011, at 9:15 p.m. She was surrounded by loved ones.

Clare, 56, was born on January 19, 1955, at St. Agnes Hospital in Baltimore, MD, to her parents, Albert Austin Snead and Edith Ava (Ratliff) Snead. Clare spent most of her childhood in Severna Park, MD, and attended school there. At the age of 19, Clare moved with her family to Ingleside, MD, and spent the majority of her life since that time on the Eastern Shore. In 1981 Clare married the late William Francis Ewing, Jr., “Bill” of Bethlehem, MD. Together they ran Bethlehem Motors until 2000 when they sold the business and moved to Denton.

Clare began working a Homestead Manor of Denton driving residents to their appointments. She loved her job because so many of the residents would share their life stories with her, and she bonded with many of them during her five years there. In 2004, Clare remarried Scott Thompson, a Chaplain in the Army. Since then she has worked for several Home Instead Senior Care branches, as she has done some traveling in the past seven years. She provided care and companionship for elderly persons, another job in which she found much delight. Clare took a specialized training course on Alzheimer’s in order to better assist her clients who suffered from the disease.

Clare was known as a sincerely compassionate selfless and loving person. She was a hard worker who balanced managing a business, home schooling, and raising her five children, and managing the household while maintaining a soft, gentle spirit. Clare loved God and served him faithfully throughout her lifetime. When she was 19, she learned to play the piano by ear and did so beautifully. She offered her gift to God and played for several churches over the years. During the last seven years, Clare was involved in the Protestant Women of the Chapel organization, actively supporting the soldiers.

Clare treasured and cherished her family; there is nothing she wouldn't do for her children and grandchildren. Her love for them will never be forgotten.

Clare is survived by her mother, Edith Snead, of Denton; her sisters Angela Cook of Oak Hall, VA, and Allison McElhany, of Denton; her children Jeffrey Snead, of Denton, Jordan Ewing and his wife Jamie, of Denton, Jeremiah Ewing of Denton, and Tiffany (Ewing) Jensen and her husband Benjamin of Easton; her grandchildren, Damien, Melanie, Brayden, and Felicity; as well as several nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her son, Joshua Lee Ewing, in 2006, and her father, Albert Snead in 2009.

Clare will forever remain in the hearts of those who loved her. Her beauty, love, and laughter will be forever missed.

A funeral service will be held on Friday, December 30, 2011, at 2 p.m. at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home in Easton. Friends may call one hour prior to the service. Burial will follow at Junior Order Cemetery in Preston, MD.
