Clarence F. Cox died at his home in Oxford on Saturday, February 26, 2005. He was 93.

Born September 29, 1911 in Bellvue, he was the son of the late Louis C. and Nellie V. Johnson Cox. After graduating from Oxford High School in 1930 he served in the U.S. Army during World War II. Following his release from active duty, he returned to Oxford where he began a life-long career as a waterman.

A life-long resident of Oxford, he was a devoted member of the Church of The Holy Trinity where he served as senior warden, head usher and was instrumental in the addition to the church building, parish house and grounds. He was a member of the Maryland Waterman Association, past member of the Oxford Vol. Fire Co., the Oxford Town Commission, the Oxford Board of Port Wardens, the Oxford Planning and Zoning Board, the Oxford Museum, the Oxford Cemetery Board, and was a volunteer for the Waterfowl Festival as a duck sitter.

Mr. Cox wife, the former Louise B. Bryan, whom he married in July 1930, died January 4, 1999.

Mr. Cox is survived by two children, "Lance" Cox of Oxford and Phyllis Frost Contee and her husband Dick of Easton; four grandchildren, Jennifer Valliant

Cox, Donald Frost and his wife Donna, Stirling Ward and her husband Timothy, and Pixie Pikus and her husband Eric; nine great-grandchildren, Melissa Frost, Brittany Frost, Courtney Frost, Graham Ward, Madison Ward, Karis Ward, Alec Pikus, Lauren Pikus and Benjamin Pikus; and a dedicated and loving caregiver, Kathy Tull Era. He was predeceased by two brothers and a sister.

Funeral services will be held on Sunday, March 6, 2005 at 11:00 AM at the Church of The Holy Trinity in Oxford.

Private burial will be at Oxford Cemetery, Oxford, MD.
