



## Clinton Eugene Phillips

May 18, 1928 - January 30, 2011

Clinton Eugene Phillips of Centreville, VA died on January 30, 2011 at Cameron Glenn Care Center in Reston, Virginia. He was 82.

Born May 18, 1928 in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late, Charles Grady and Annie C. Walskey Phillips. He graduated from Boy's Latin High School in Baltimore, MD in the Class of 1946. On October 4, 1947 he married the former, Margaret Ellen Nichalson of Baltimore, MD. In 1953 he entered the U.S. Army and served two years. Following his release from active duty he returned to Baltimore and began working for the B. & O Railroad, where he stayed for almost 40 years. During this time they were later known as the Chessie System and then C.S.X. Railroad. He retired on April 5, 1989 and then moved to Naples, FL where he lived until 1997 when they moved to Sun City Center, FL. On October 2, 2005 they moved to Centreville, VA to be near family.

He was a life member of the Kent Island Volunteer Fire Co., member of the Centreville Masonic Lodge #180 AF& AM, Boumi Temple, and a charter member of the Kent Island Elks Lodge. He had been a Lions Club member of Kent Island Lions Club, and Signal Hill Lions Club, Manassas Park, VA and the Centreville, VA Vol. Fire Co, the Centreville United Methodist Church, Centreville, VA and a past member of the Kent Island United Methodist Church, Chester, MD.

Mr. Phillips is survived by his wife, Margaret Ellen Nichalson Phillips; a daughter, Beverly Mowery Cooper, and her husband Dale of Oak Hill, VA; an adopted daughter, Beverly Ann Burket and her husband, Donald of Millersville, MD; five grandchildren, Jeffery and Melissa Mowery, Nicole Hudgens, Joseph and James Cooper; and two great granddaughters Hailey and Caitlin Hudgens.

Funeral services will be held at the Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P. A., Chester, MD on Friday, February 4, 2011 11AM, where friends may call from 2-4 and 6 – 8 on Thursday, February 3, 2011. Interment will be at Stevensville Cemetery, Stevensville, MD.
