



## Col. Jack Burley Churchill

Col. Jack B. Churchill, U.S. Army ret. of Tilghman, MD died on Saturday, July 7, 2007 at Memorial Hospital at Easton. He was 78.

Born October 5, 1928 in Pittsburgh, PA, he was the son of the late Delmar Deforest and Marie Burley Churchill. He attended the University of Omaha where he received his Bachelor of Business Administration degree in 1964. While serving in the U.S. Army, he attended the Army General Staff College in Fort Levinworth, Kansas. Col. Churchill served in Korea, Germany, Vietnam, and at The Pentagon in Arlington, VA. Most recently he had worked as a Multi-Regional Manager for Arbitron Television Ratings.

A resident of Tighman since 1994, he was a member of the Tilghman Vol. Fire Co. where he served as an administrator and a member of the ambulance team.

Col. Churchill is survived by his wife, the former Geraldine Severson, whom he married June 7, 1954 in Miami, FL; three children, Diane Marie Lackey and her husband Michael, Mark Stuart Churchill, and Brian Anderson Churchill; three grandchildren, William Pulkownik, Kyle Lackey, and Erin Lackey; and a dear family friend, David Sager.
