Constance "Connie" McNeal peacefully passed away at her home in Easton, MD, on Wednesday, October 26, 2011. She was 71.

Mrs. McNeal was born in Easton on March 13, 1940. She was the daughter of the late Arthur W. Dobson and Constance Collier. On August 26, 1956, she married James Lee McNeal.

Mrs. McNeal worked in the cafeteria for Talbot County Public Schools in Trappe, MD, for three years in the 1970's. She retired as a supervisor after 24 years from Black and Decker in the late 1990's.

In addition to her husband, Mrs. McNeal is survived by her two sons, Jamie McNeal (Toni Hall) and Tim McNeal (Patty), both of Easton; seven grandchildren, Josh McNeal, Lindsey McNeal, Katelyn McNeal, Christyna Spurry, David Spurry, Amanda McNeal, and Noah Spurry; and three great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death in 2003 by a brother, Arthur Dobson; and in 2009, a granddaughter, Megan McNeal. Mrs. McNeal is also survived by a former daughter-in-law, Belinda Sewell.
