Daniel Franklin Geib, Jr., 75, of Cordova, MD, died on Friday, August 8, 2014, at his home. Born in Easton on July 26, 1939, he was the son of the late Daniel Franklin Geib, Sr., and Anna Marguerite Crockett Geib.

Mr. Geib was a graduate of Bridgewater College in Bridgewater, VA. After working as an insurance agent for more than thirty years, he began a career in farming.
