David Kirk Funk of Centreville, Maryland, passed away unexpectedly on January 22, 2025, at the age of 51. Dave touched the lives of everyone he met and will be remembered as a loving husband, a dedicated father, and a helpful friend to all. His legacy of kindness, humor, and unwavering support will live on in the hearts of those who were fortunate to know him.

Throughout his life, Dave achieved so much through his hard work, dedication, and passion for the things he loved. A proud and accomplished hockey coach, he mentored players across several teams, including Queen Anne's County High School, Delaware Ducks Hockey Club, and Lady Ducks, sharing his knowledge and love for the game while shaping the lives of countless young athletes. He also spent many years, with the Eastern Shore Hockey Association, and served as Vice President. For Dave, hockey wasn't just a sport, it was a lifestyle and every player, parent and coach were family. 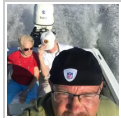
