David Harvey Tremain of Easton, MD, passed away April 17, 2013. He was born to the late, Arthur Tremain and Gladys Cole Tremain on December 2, 1938, in Bemidji, MN.

David grew up and graduated from High School in Sidney, OH. He went on to receive a Masters degree from The Ohio State University. He made a career for himself in Dayton, OH. I will remember the smile and the energy he brought to any work assignment or event he was a part of. But most of all I loved his competitive spirit. It wasn't just with his Buckeyes it was in cards (gin especially), in golf, in making quotas and he has to be the only guy who was responsible for changing a rule in what was the annual Berry Company Co-ed softball tournament.

The tourney was a key part of the Berry culture for many years and Dave would pitch for his team and when I would come up to bat he would throw pitch after pitch no where near the strike zone because the original rules did not have walks. The next year we implemented balls and strikes and he would still not throw a pitch to me and several others within 10 feet of the plate. This resulted in what we affectionately called the "Tremain" rule where a walk to a male resulted in an automatic walk to the female immediately following in the batting order. He of course lobbied against the rule change in the organization meeting as I recall but you had to love his great competitive spirit.
