David Michael Smith of St. Michaels, MD died Friday, April 1, 2005 at Georgetown University Hospital of final stage liver disease. He had been the recipient of a liver transplant on August 1, 2004. He was 43.

Born March 10, 1962 at Fort Campbell, KY, the son of Joe and Darlene Smith, he studied at The University of Tennessee at Knoxville. He worked in New York City for Pier Dux, and in the fine clock department of Tiffany and Company. A resident of St. Michaels since 1989, Mr. Smith was co-proprietor of Justine's Ice-Cream Parlor. He was very active in civic and education activities. From 1994 through 1998 he served as a commissioner of the Town of St. Michaels. Subsequently, from 1998 through 2002 he served on the St. Michaels Utilities Commission. While serving as a St. Michaels Commissioner, David was instrumental in the design, fundraising efforts, and construction of the gazebo at Muskrat Park.

David Smith was devoted to the arts and to arts education. In 1991 he acted in the Avalon Theatre production of "The Lion in Winter." Since 1993, David Smith has volunteered for the Talbot County Public Schools in a variety of roles. In 1997 & 1998 he participated in the St. Michaels School's productions of "Oliver" and "Annie." For the past 13 years he has volunteered as an assistant producer for the Easton High School Music Department's annual musical plays. At the Easton High School Music Department's musical productions, he provided props, costumes, and sets. Mostly, he encouraged and coached so many talented students through their performances.

Mr. Smith is survived by his life companion of 19 years, Thomas M. Quimby of St. Michaels, his parents Joe and Darlene Smith of Summertown, TN., His brother Phillip and wife Anita, niece Sara Beth and nephew Jake, brother Jason and wife Lynn, all of Summertown, TN., his Aunt Judy, many Aunts and Uncles, and dear friends Bill, Diane and Zoe Thomas, of St. Michaels. He is preceded in death by paternal grandparents, Floyd and Opal Smith of Nashville, TN and Maternal grandparents Troy and Julia Long of Lawrenceburg, TN.

The liturgy of the burial of the dead will be conducted at Christ Church (Episcopal) in St. Michaels, Saturday, April 9, 2005 at 12:00 noon.
