



David T. Weston

December 2, 1916 - August 16, 2010

David T. Weston of Easton, formerly of Denton, died at the Memorial Hospital at Easton on August 16, 2010.

Born December 2, 1916 in Philipsburg, PA, he was the son of the late, Thomas Heckman and Sarah Forshey Weston. After graduating from high school in Philipsburg, PA, he married the former Alta Mae Hanson on November 9, 1940 in Washington, DC. They made their home in Silver Spring, MD. He entered the U.S. Army where he received his basic training in Fort Bragg, NC in 1942. He attended various schools, including the Officers Candidate School in Fort Sill, OK. He was assigned to the 12th Armored Division Artillery at Camp Campbell, KY in 1943 and was shipped to the European Theatre of Operations in 1944 until January 1945, when he received the American Silver Star from the U.A. Army for gallantry in action. He also received from the Army of the Republic of France the LaCroix Deguerre Avecetolie De Vermeil. After his release from active duty, he worked for the United States Post Office from 1936 – 1951, at which time he began his own woodworking business know as Weston Woodworking Company in Rockville, MD, which he operated until 1978. After this, he was a missionary with Helps International Ministry, serving in Mexico, Japan, Israel and the United States.

He was a member of the Presbyterian Church of Atonement of Silver Spring,

MD, and the First Wesleyan Church of Easton.

Mr. Weston is survived by two sons, Dr. Thomas S. Weston of San Diego, CA, and Jon David Weston of Rockville, MD; seven grandchildren; and ten great-grandchildren. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife; a daughter, Shelley Weston-Stowe; one brother; and three sisters.

A funeral service will be held at the Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Easton on Wednesday, August 25 at 7:30 pm, where friends may call beginning at 6:00 pm.
