



Derek J. Weatherley

December 5, 1925 - August 5, 2014

Derek John Weatherley of Easton, MD, formerly of Old Bethpage, NY, died on August 5, 2014, at the age of 89. Born in London, England, on December 5, 1925, he was the son of Arthur Ashdowne Weatherley and Eileen Petty who raised him in the nearby town of North Harrow. He was the husband of the late Margaret K. Weatherley and the father of Brian A. Weatherley.

Derek served in the British Army in Palestine as a paratrooper and immigrated to the United States in his early twenties after which he launched his professional career as a mechanical engineer. He settled in Old Bethpage on Long Island working the majority of his business life as an air pollution control specialist for Ducon where his responsibilities led to extensive travel through Europe including a three-year stay in Bonn, Germany.

Once retired, Derek and his wife Margaret lived in Easton, MD, where they became active members of the community and formed many friendships through volunteer work at the Academy Art Museum in Easton, the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum in St. Michaels, and at the Londonderry Retirement Community. In addition to his volunteer activities, Derek found great pleasure in sailing, ship model building, and golf; he was also an enthusiastic water color artist.

Derek J. Weatherley is survived by his son, Brian A. Weatherley of Baltimore,

MD, and two grandchildren, Kaitlin and Jeffrey Infante of Youngstown, OH.

A memorial service will be held at St. Marks United Methodist Church, 100 Peachblossom Rd, Easton at 1 p.m. on Saturday, September 13, 2014. In lieu of flowers, a donation to the Endowment Fund of St. Mark's United Methodist Church would be appreciated.
