Diana B. McLellan, of Washington, DC, died on Wednesday, June 25, 2014. She was 76.

Born in England on September 22, 1937, she was the daughter of the late Harold Dicken and Phyllis Gathercoal Dicken. A Washington reporter, author, feature writer, magazine journalist, critic, editor, and poet, she spent 10 years as a gossip columnist, "The Ear," for the Washington Star, The Washington Post, and The Washington Times.

She is survived by her husband, Dr. Richard X. McLellan, Jr.; daughter, Fiona N. Weeks and son-in-law, Joseph F. Weeks; granddaughter, Tara G. Sullivan; grandsons, Samuel W. Weeks and Harold "Griff" Weeks; and two great-grandchildren.

Services were held on Saturday, June 28 at 1 p.m. at Congressional Cemetery, 1801 E. St., SE, Washington DC, 20003, in the chapel.
