



Dominick Danzo

May 21, 1915 - October 11, 2012

Dominick Danzo, 97, of Easton, MD, passed away peacefully at Easton Memorial Hospital on October 11, 2012. He was being held by his daughter and son-in-law and passed, into the arms of his beloved spouse, Carmella.

He was born in New York City on May 21, 1915, to the late Angelina and Rocco Danzo. His career began at the War Department in Binghamton, NY, at the Medical Supply Depot, and continued in Sommerville, NJ, as a Warehouse Supervisor for the Veterans Administration, beginning in the 1940's. Dom later transferred to the U.S. Postal Service as a letter carrier and then was employed an additional five years for J.P. Morgan Chase until his final retirement. Prior to the above employment, he was enlisted in the Civilian Conservation Corps, working on several of the Nations National Parks, until 1934. Dominick also, prior to Federal Employment, worked as a jewelry stone setter from 1938 to 1941.

Dominick was known as the Mayor of Thompson Street in Greenwich Village where he was raised and later lived for over sixty years. He was always helping friends and business owners in the neighborhood. He was very handy and could do electrical work, repair TV's and radios in addition to his talent as a jewelry maker.

Dominick was married in Dunmore, PA, in 1939, lived in Binghamton, NY, for several years before returning to Greenwich Village for over sixty years before

moving to Maryland to be near his daughter.

He was preceded in death by his wife just four months ago and a son who passed in 1945 at the age of five. In addition, he lost three brothers.

He is survived by his loving and devoted daughter, Nancy, and son-in law Stephen Cossu of Tilghman Island, MD. He has six married grandsons, and eight great-grandchildren; a son, Daniel, and his spouse of Gerrardstown, WV; and two sisters, Lucy Pellone and Vita Derosa.

A viewing will be held at Perazzo Funeral Home, followed by a mass and burial all taking place in New York City.
