Donald Wallace Brothers of Centreville, MD, died on August 1, 2014, at The Hospice Center of Queen Anne's County. He was 86.

Donald Brothers was born in Washington, DC, on April 10, 1928, to the late Wallace and Evelyn Brothers. He graduated from Western High School Class of 1946 and then attended the University of Oklahoma. On January 22, 1955, he married Mary Anne Keane of Washington, DC. Mr. Brothers served in the US Army in Germany after attending college. He went to work for the Army Defense Mapping Agency as a cartographer for 30 years. As a hobby, Mr. Brothers enjoyed woodworking, and making numerous things for his family and friends.

Mr. Brothers is survived by his wife, Mary Anne Brothers; daughter, Anne Brothers of Spring, TX; son, Andrew Brothers of Tucson, AZ; son, Matthew Brothers of Chase City, VA; daughter, Martha Smith of Germantown, MD; six grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.
