Donna Kay Stohrer, of Chestertown, died March 6th, after a long illness. She was born in Baltimore on September 23, 1943 and was the daughter of the late August and Adeline Ludwig. She grew up in Dundalk and graduated from Dundalk High School. She attended Prince George's Community College, where she earned an Associate's degree in Nursing, and was subsequently certified as a Registered Nurse. She worked in the Cardiac Care Unit at Prince George's Hospital, as a Public Health Nurse, and had private patients. After moving to Chestertown in 1985, Donna was the Director of the Adult Day Center of the Kent County Mental Health Association and was a Psychiatric Nurse with the Tri-County Mobile Health Unit. Donna was predeceased by sister Alice Rohart and brother Edgar (Ted) Ludwig.

She is survived by her older sister, Sandra Adams, of Baltimore, her husband, Donald C. (Coby) Stohrer, of Chestertown, and three sons, Joseph Insinga of Augusta, Georgia; Andrew Insinga of Redmond, Oregon; and Matthew Stohrer of Raleigh, North Carolina; and six grandchildren.
