May 9, 1931 - July 26, 2014

Doris Elizabeth Jordan of Greensboro, MD, died Saturday, July 26, 2014, at Anne Arundel Medical Center. She was 83.

Born May 9, 1931, in Glasgow, Scotland, she was the daughter of the late Thomas and Phoebe Dunbar Walters. A native of Scotland, Doris immigrated to the U.S. at the age of 18. She studied hard and became an American citizen that same year. She married her husband Bill in 1952. In addition to raising her family, Doris has been a tireless worker in her church and with senior service agencies. She volunteers at nursing homes and other outreach ministries.

Doris is survived by her husband William Jabez Jordan of Greensboro; four children, JoAnne Jones and her husband Morris of Greensboro, William Douglas Jordan and his wife Michele of Goldsboro, Lyn Stup and her husband Harry, Sr., of Stevensville, and Cassy Jordan of Chester; thirteen grandchildren; and twelve great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her two brothers, Douglas Dunbar of Glasgow, Scotland and Thomas McWilliams of Ontario, Canada. She is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews both in the U.S. and in Scotland.

A funeral service will be at 11 a.m., Thursday, July 31, 2014, at First Baptist Church of Kent Island. A visitation will be from 6-8 p.m. on Wednesday July

30, 2014, at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Chester. Burial will follow the service at Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery in Hurlock.
