Dorothy Deringer Olson “Dottie” passed away on August 3, 2014, at Heartland House in Grasonville, MD.

Dorothy was born on December 8, 1926, in Harrisburg, PA, to the late Clifton Hurt and Josephine Dinsmore Deringer. Dorothy graduated from Juniata College in Huntingdon, PA, and after graduation she became a teacher. Dorothy married George Olson in 1951.
