November 7, 1913 - June 24, 2015

Dorothy Valentine Rowland, 101, was born on November 7, 1913, in Columbus, OH, and passed away on June 24, 2015.

She attended Central High School in Columbus, OH, and was a contemporary of legendary track star Jessie Owens.

Dorothy was married to Francis Rowland (deceased) on December 12, 1935. She was employed at Curtis Wright Aviation as an executive secretary during World War II; served as a youth leader at Morgan Memorial Methodist Church in Columbus, OH; and retired as a medical secretary for Dr. Reynold E. Klages of Columbus, OH. In 2003, Dorothy moved to Easton, MD, with her daughter and son-in-law. She was a deeply spiritual person and a dedicated member of the Oxford United Methodist Church, where she made many loving and lasting friendships.

Dorothy was a successful artist and maker of fine painted china figurines. She enjoyed gardening and walking outdoors. Dorothy's kindness and love touched the hearts of many and will serve as her legacy.

She was one of four children and was preceded in death by her sister, Beulah Valentine Krugh (Kale); her brother, Harold Valentine; and sister-in-law, Marilyn Valentine. Dorothy is survived by her daughter, Sandra Rowland-
