



Dorothy Neighbors Whitby

June 24, 1919 - September 1, 2010

Dorothy Neighbors Whitby of Queenstown, Maryland died on September 1, 2010 at Corsica Hills Nursing Home. She was 91.

Born on June 24, 1919, in Ruthsburg, Maryland, she was the daughter of the late, Elmer and Delma Quimby Neighbors. She attended Centreville Elementary and High School. On November 2, 1940 she married Elmer Whitby and they resided in Carmichael. In 1947 they became owners of Whitby's General Store in Carmichael. During her lifetime she operated the General Store and was the Manager of the Chesapeake College bookstore for 18 years. She was also the Treasurer of the Carmichael Homemaker's Club and the Wye of Carmichael United Methodist Church.

Mrs. Whitby is survived by her husband of almost 70 years, Elmer Whitby of Queenstown, MD; her daughter, Kay Whitby Zerwick, of Alexandria, Virginia; her granddaughter, Amy Elizabeth Zerwick of Alexandria, Virginia, and one sister, Betty Wiest, of Glen Burnie, Maryland.
