December 31, 1920 - March 8, 2010

Dorothy Williams Mielke of Easton, MD died March 8, 2010. She was 89 years old.

Dorothy W. Mielke was born December 31, 1920 in Royal Oak, MD, the daughter of the late, Edward Thomas Williams, Jr. and Minnie Seymour Williams. After graduating from Easton High School in 1937, Mrs. Mielke attended Strayer Business College. From 1940 to 1947, Mrs. Mielke worked at Memorial Hospital at Easton. She married Herman F. Mielke on January 22, 1944 and helped run The Furniture Mart, a business founded by her husband until the business was sold in 1972. Mrs. Mielke then assisted her husband in his career in local politics and civic affairs, and worked at Genieve's Dress Shop, Oscar Kaplan Jewelry, and Lomax Jewelry.

She was a member of the Ladies of the Elks Lodge #1622 and a member of the Memorial Hospital at Easton Auxiliary Association. Mrs. Mielke was a devoted and caring wife, mother, grandmother, and friend and loved gardening, reading, and knitting.

Mrs. Mielke was preceded in death by her beloved husband of 57 years, Herman F. Mielke.

She is survived by her three children, two sons of Easton, Allan F. Mielke and

Robert D. Mielke, and a daughter, M. Elaine Mielke, of Washington, DC; seven grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at a date to be set in the near future.
