Douglas Lee Hjenvik of Easton, MD, passed away peacefully on Thursday, May 1, 2014, at his home. He was 62.

Douglas was born on May 20, 1951, in Hettinger, ND. He was the son of Lorraine M. Oberlander Hjenvik Bruckner and the late John C. Hjenvik

Douglas married the former Bonnie Ann Fowler on October 29, 1977. They have resided in Easton since 1984.

Mr. Hjenvik worked as a CT/MRI Technologist at UM Shore Regional Health for 29 years. He was a member of the Easton Elks Lodge 1622.
