



## Earl Newsome

June 23, 1914 - April 4, 2008

Earl Francis Newsome of Chestertown, MD., died Friday, April 4, 2008 at Chester River Manor in Chestertown, MD. He was 93.

Earl F. Newsome was born June 23, 1914 in Queen Anne's County, the son of the late Lewis Newsome and Margaret "Walker" Newsome. Mr. Newsome was one of thirteen children. He began working at a young age for Great Oak Farm in Chestertown, MD and then worked as a painter for Edgar Lipscomb and Charley Porter in Chestertown. He married Mae Jacob Kendall of Rock Hall, MD. Together they lived in Rock Hall, MD., at which time Mr. Newsome went to work for the State Highway Administration in the maintenance department. He retired from the State Highway Administration in 1976. After his wife's death he moved to Lambs Meadow Rd. in Chestertown. Mr. Newsome was an active member in I.U. Church for several years. He enjoyed spending time with his family and dancing.

In addition to his parents Mr. Newsome was preceded in death by his wife Mae Jacob Newsome, one sister, Mary Ann Nicholson, and eleven brothers, M. Edward Newsome, Frank S.
