



## Edgar Charles Ludwig

Edgar C. "Ted" Ludwig of Chestertown, MD died on October 5, 2021, at UMMC at Chestertown. He was 75.

He was born in Baltimore, MD on July 10, 1946 the son of the late August and Adeline Singer Ludwig.

He was a graduate of Dundalk High School and the University of Maryland College Park, where he was awarded a Bachelor's degree in Agriculture Science.

He worked with the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) until serving in the US Air Force in England. Upon his honorable discharge he returned to work as an agricultural inspector with the USDA at Dulles and Miami International Airports.

While living in Miami he subsequently worked as paint manager with Central Hardware and as a caretaker for several large estates in the Miami Beach area.

He later moved to the Eastern Shore where, because he spoke fluent Spanish, he worked with Choptank Health as a patient advocate at their Goldsboro office. He later worked briefly with the Maryland Department of Human Resources and cared for his ailing family.

He loved to write.

He is survived by his two sisters: Sandra Adams of Lutherville, MD, and Donna Kay Stohrer of Chestertown, MD, along with nieces and nephews.
