Until we meet again, keep watch over all of us and I hope I make you proud as I stay here for Brenda, Joey, Chelsea, Mary, the grandchildren.

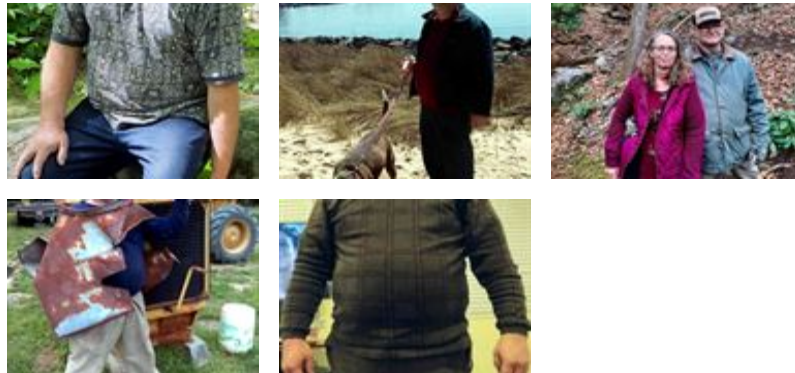
