Edgar Franklin Zepp, III, "Bear", died on Thursday, August 14, 2008 at his home. He was 62 years old.

Frank was born on January 23, 1946 to Edgar F. Zepp, Jr and June A. Gettman Zepp in Baltimore, MD. He attended Severna Park High School, graduating in 1964. In the 1970s and 1980s, he worked as a truck driver for Color Tile, Supermart, North American Van Lines, and MediQuik. He also worked for Nabisco as a fork lift operator. He received his Associates Degree from Chesapeake College in 1992.

He was very active in the ministry, ministering to the elderly and people living in the assisted living facilities in the area, and specifically The Pines.

Frank is survived by his mother, June A Zepp of Stevensville, MD; brother, Mark Zepp of Stevensville, MD; nephew, Cory Zepp of Stevensville, MD; and niece, Becki Zepp of Stevensville, MD.
