



Edward Cameron Kirk Hall Esq.

August 20, 1934 - September 13, 2023

Edward Cameron Kirk Hall of Chestertown, Maryland, died peacefully at his home on September 13, 2023. He was born on August 20, 1934, in Merion, Pennsylvania, to the late Dorothy and Clarence Hall.

Kirk was class of 1953 at the Episcopal Academy in Overbrook, Pennsylvania, and thereafter attended Amherst College, where he graduated in 1957. He played soccer, becoming an All-American in 1956, and was a member of the Alpha Delta Phi fraternity. He graduated from Villanova University Law School in 1961 and commenced private practice in Norristown, Pennsylvania. He subsequently became Assistant General Counsel of Philadelphia Electric Company, from where he retired in 1992.

His many passions included sailing, ocean racing, skiing, scuba diving, woodworking, choral singing and folk music. He was a member of the Cruising Club of America (CCA), the Corinthian Yacht Club of Philadelphia and the Singing City Choir.

Kirk was preceded in death by his sister, Janet, his brother, Gordon, his first wife, Nancy and his daughter, Jennifer. He is survived by his beloved wife of 52 years, Gisela, his three sons, Cameron, Jonathan and Daniel, and his five delightful granddaughters, Hadley, Cooper, Julina, Liv and Mia. He will be missed by the Chestertown community, his family in Europe and the many sailors he met with Gisela on a 15-year circumnavigation onboard their Whitby 42, Serenade.

An interment service will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Kent, 7579 Sandy Bottom Rd, Chestertown, MD 21620, at 11.00am on Friday, October 27, 2023, followed by a celebration of Kirk's life at the Chester River Yacht & Country Club.
