Edward B. Kotzen of Chester, MD, died on May 11, 2014, at the University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore. He was 75.

Ed was born on May 26, 1938, in Philadelphia, PA, to the late Herman and Esther Kotzen. He grew up in the Philadelphia area, and graduated from Temple University. After graduation, he began his career with the Department of the Navy in Philadelphia and later Washington, DC. Ed retired in 1996 and has lived on Kent Island since 2006.

Ed loved baseball, physical fitness, politics, and traveling. He volunteered at the Grasonville Senior Center from 2007 to 2008.

Ed is survived by his wife, Patricia Kotzen; daughter Dawn Caracci and her husband George, and granddaughter Brooke. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his son, Kevin.

Services will be held on Thursday, May 15, 2014, at 11 a.m. at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home in Chester, MD. Interment will follow at Stevensville Cemetery.
