



Edward Carlton Cannon

Edward C. Cannon, of Trappe, died at the Mallard Bay Nursing Center, Cambridge, on Sunday, December 7, 2003. He was 92.

Born in Queen Anne's County, September 15, 1911, he was the son of the late James Alfred and Linda Comegys Cannon. For many years, he worked for the Eastern Shore Nursery in Easton. He continued in this line of work until his retirement in the 1990's.

A resident of Talbot County for the majority of his life, he was a World War II veteran having served in the European Theatre of Operations with General Patton as a member of Company B, Sixth Armored Division. He participated in the campaigns in Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland and Central Europe. He was wounded in action in France on Nov. 21, 1944. After recuperating, he re-joined his unit and was later honorably discharged October 16, 1945 with a Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart Medal, Good Conduct Medal and the European African Eastern Service Ribbon.

His memberships included the Talbot Post #70, American Legion and E. E. Streets Memorial Post #5118, V.F.W., both in Easton.

His wife, the former Evelyn Eason whom he married Nov. 15, 1953, died August 12, 1976.

Mr. Cannon is survived by a sister, Lillian C. Mills, of Salisbury and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held on Tuesday, December 9th, at 2 P.M. at the Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P. A., Easton, where friends may call one hour prior to service.

Burial will be at Spring Hill Cemetery, Easton.
