



Edwin Earl Brodhead

Edwin Brodhead passed away at his home in Easton on April 27, 2013, with his loving family by his side. He was a resident of Easton for the past nineteen years and enjoyed watching tennis, traveling, and watching birds and wildlife in his backyard.

Mr. Brodhead was born in Madison, NJ. He was the son of the late John S. Brodhead and Margaret Rettalick Brodhead. He graduated from Madison High School, where he met his wife, Shirley. They married in 1950 and resided and raised their children in Madison before retiring to Easton in 1993. Edwin was a member of the Izaak Walton League and the Talbot Post 70 American Legion.

He worked for the Woolworth Company in the 1950s. He later purchased his own business, Bomont News and Toy Center in Boonton, NJ, in 1956, and worked there until 1988. He then worked at the Madison campus of Fairleigh Dickinson University until his retirement. He was in the National Guard and served in the United States Army in Korea, during the Korean conflict.
