



E. Jeanette Lomax

July 18, 1941 - November 4, 2009

E. Jeanette Lomax of Easton, MD died on Wednesday, November 4, 2009. She was 68 years old.

Born July 18, 1941 in Harmony, MD, she was the daughter of the late, James Elbert and Ethel Lillian Thomas Richards. After graduating from Preston High School in 1959, she worked as a secretary at Service Trucking Company and later at Preston Trucking Company. In 1966 she was employed by Memorial Hospital at Easton, where she remained until 1995. She then worked as a telephone operator and cashier at David Wheeler Volvo until 2001. She returned to Memorial Hospital at Easton until April 2004, retiring due to illness. She then returned for a short time to David Wheeler Volvo, working part-time. A real people person, she always loved her jobs working with the public. She loved music and family. She had made many friends; even her doctors were more like friends to her.

Her dear husband, Arthur L. Lomax, whom she married in Preston, MD in January, 1972, died in March, 1998.

She has been a member of First Wesleyan Church in Easton since 1998.

Mrs. Lomax is survived by a daughter, Roxanne Lomax Mitchell, of Cordova; a sister, Margaret Anne Richards, of Denton; a brother, Paul Kenneth Richards,

of Preston, and one grandson, Brandon Harris. Her brother, James E. "Jimbo" Richards, died in 1993.

Funeral services will be held on Wednesday, November 11, 2009 at 11:00 a.m. at First Wesleyan Church, 620 Goldsboro Street in Easton, with Pastor David Griffin officiating.
