Elizabeth (Betty) Stickle Brosius died on Monday, July 14, 2014. at the Dixon House in Easton, MD. She was 93.

Betty was born on July 9, 1921, in Selinsgrove, PA. She was raised by her maternal grandparents, Effie and George Bressler.

She married Vernon Schnee Brosius in June 1941. She and her husband lived for many years in Sharon, PA, before moving to Ellicott City, MD. In 1969, Betty and her husband moved to Centreville, MD.
