Elizabeth P. Hagen, 92, of New York passed away at Lenox Hill Hospital on February 7, 2008.

Born on December 2, 1915 in Centreville, MD she was the daughter of the late Charles Hagen and Katherine Hagen. Her early years were spent in Centreville, MD. She graduated from Centreville High School; Centreville, MD and went to Western Maryland College to receive her B.S. degree. After graduating from Western Maryland College she served four years in the Navy and was a Lieutenant at the time of her separation. She then went on to graduate from Columbia University where she received her Masters and PhD. in Psychology.

She began her professional career as a high school science teacher. In 1950, she became a research associate and lecturer in the Department of Psychology at Teachers College, Columbia University. From 1972-1976, she served as Dean of Academic Affairs at Teachers College. In 1978, she was named the Edward Lee Thorndike Professor of Psychology and Education, a ranking she held as a professor emeritus. In 1960, the American Personnel and Guidance Association presented her with the Outstanding Research Award for her work as project coordinator and co-author of the project findings of the Ten Thousand Careers Study. In 1970, she was elected a fellow of the American Psychological Association. She was also elected to the National

Academy of Education in 1979.

She retired from teaching in 1981 and since then was the co-author of the Stanford-Binet Intelligence Scale: Fourth Edition and as a co-author of Forms 4, 5, and 6 of the Cognitive Abilities Test.

She is survived by her nephew, James Hagen and his wife, Melanie of Hartly, DE; three nieces Elizabeth Bages and her husband, Brian of Dover, DE; Grace Donophan and her husband, Clarence of Wyoming, DE; and Ann Schuman of Northfield, NJ. She was also predeceased by three brothers, James Hagen, Charles Hagen, John Hagen, and a sister, Minnie Dawkins.

A graveside service will be held at 10 am on Monday, February 25, 2008 at the Chesterfield Cemetery in Centreville, MD.
