Elizabeth Jane “Betty” Greener Henry passed away peacefully on April 22, 2020. She was 81.

She was born on November 22, 1938 in Brooklyn, New York, daughter of the late Dr. John Hunter Greener and Cecilia Clare Greaves.

Mrs. Henry received her Bachelor’s degree in English from Wells College in Aurora, NY, in 1960 and was employed as a copywriter. After college, she married James E. Henry, Jr. on July 8, 1961, in Brooklyn, NY. They made their first home in Metuchen, NJ, until 1964 when they moved to Glen Cove, NY. In 1990, they moved to Wayne, NJ, where they lived until 2015 when Mrs. Henry moved to Easton.

Betty will be remembered most for her love of the outdoors and the arts, more specifically her love of literature, her ability and talent for writing thoughtful cards and letters, as well as her recent affinity for the Chesapeake Bay and the community at Londonderry.

She is survived by her children, James E. Henry III of Baldwin, NY, Claire Greaves Moore of Chesapeake, VA, and Sean Hunter Henry of Camas, WA; her sister, Ann Ottaviano of Vero Beach, FL; her six grandchildren, Matthew Moore, Michele Moore, Ryan Henry, Patrick Henry, Caroline Henry, Leigh
