Elizabeth McBride of Easton, MD, passed peacefully at William Hill Manor on Friday, July 11, surrounded by her family. She was 75.

Elizabeth was born on November 13, 1938, in Phillipsburg, PA. She lived most of her life in St. Mary's, PA, married to Eugene McBride raising their three children.
