



Elizabeth Howard Owings

November 12, 1953 - January 6, 2012

Elizabeth Howard Owings, 58, died January 6, 2012 at the Hospice of Queen Anne's in Centreville, MD from complications related to cancer. Prior to her stay at the hospice center, Ms. Owings lived in the Crossroads Community, a Centreville-based non-profit organization assisting those with chronic mental illness.

In a July, 2011 article in the Queen Anne's Record-Observer, Ms. Owings expressed her appreciation for the facility: "It's really an answer from God," she said. "I've never been to a place so nice . . . there's so much privacy and peace." Liz, as she was known to family and friends, was born on November 12, 1953 in Baltimore. After living aboard a sailboat for a year, homeschooling and adventuring with her family between the Chesapeake Bay and the Bahamas, she moved to a Millington-area farm in the mid 1960s. She graduated from Chestertown High School and attended nursing school at Villanova University until she was forced to withdraw by the mental illness that plagued her throughout her adult life.

Liz's placid blue eyes and soft voice revealed the gentle and innocent spirit that fell prey to her persistent schizophrenia. In conversation a few days prior to taking her last breath, Liz was asked what kind of shows she liked to watch on television. "I like shows about ice cream and cake," she answered.

Liz is predeceased by her mother, Mary Frances Owings, and her brother, Richard Dorsey Owings. She is survived by her father, Meredith Dorsey Owings of Millington, MD; her sister and brother-in-law, Becky and Dennis Forney, of Lewes, Delaware; her brother, Samuel Sheridan Owings, of Chestertown, MD; and a sister-in-law, Gail Webb Owings.

A memorial service for Ms. Owings will be held at noon on Thursday, January 19, 2012 at the Crossroads Community at 120 Banjo Lane, Centreville, MD 21617. For those wishing to remember Ms. Owings, the family suggests donations to the Crossroads Community or to the Hospice of Queen Anne's at 255 Comet Drive, Centreville, MD 21617.
