Elizabeth Neidert Smith, passed away on Wednesday, February 17, 2016, at Heartlands Assisted Living at Severna Park. She was 93.

Born December 9, 1922, in Baltimore, MD, she was the daughter of the late Charles A. and Elizabeth Kuehne Neidert. Elizabeth married Melvin W. Smith on June 13, 1942. She was a 1943 graduate of Western Maryland College.

She began working for Arthur Slade Regional Catholic School as a Language Arts teacher, where she taught for 27 years. She was a resident of Severna Park for 48 years and Kent Island for 42 years.

Elizabeth was the First Welcome Wagon Lady in Severna Park in the 1950's. She enjoyed volunteering at Estate Treasures in Chester, MD, and she was also an active member and reader at the Christ Episcopal Church of Kent Island. She was a member of the Kent Island Art Federation. Her hobbies included reading, cooking, singing, playing bridge, and welcoming friends and family with a smile.

She is survived by her daughter, S. Deborah Burns of Severna Park; her son, M. Gregory Smith of Centreville; six grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. She is preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Melvin; and a son, Douglas K. Smith.
