E. Frances Scott Wallis of Chestertown, MD died on Friday October 24, 2008 at Chestertown Nursing & Rehabilitation Center in Chestertown, MD. She was 85.

She was born on December 10, 1922 in England, the daughter of the late Archibald and Kathleen Lavery Sinclair. She moved to the United States shortly after WWII and soon married Roy Edward Scott. They lived in Chestertown, MD where she raised her family and worked at Drug Fair running the cafeteria. She then became a Pharmacy Technician at Drug Fair which later became Rite Aid. Her husband predeceased her in 1957. She remarried to Ludolph Wallis of Kennedyville, MD in 1958; he predeceased her in the early 80's. Mrs. Wallis retired in the early 1990's. She then worked at Park Cleaners, Suds 'n' Soda, McBrides Cleaners and Lane's Liquors (now the Outpost) well into her 80's. She was a member of the Double Creek Methodist Church. Mrs. Wallis will be remembered most of all for visiting those less fortunate in local nursing homes and enjoyed helping to put a smile on their face.
