June 26, 1916 - October 15, 2011

Elizabeth M. Flower of Centreville, MD died Saturday October 15, 2011 at Corsica Hills Nursing Home. She was 95.

Born in Colts Neck, NJ on June 26, 1916 she was the daughter of the late Everett and Huldah Sickles Matthews.

Elizabeth grew up in the Red Bank, NJ area. She worked for the Signal Corps during World War II. She was a witness to the Hindenburg explosion and burning in May 1937. She married Edwin Flower in 1951 and moved to Centreville, MD where she lived the rest of her life. They had one daughter, Elizabeth S. Flower.

She was an avid gardener and grew many flowers and vegetables at the farm in Burrisville. She loved people and spent time listening to their stories. She kept numerous journals with accounts of the local weather and crops. She loved animals and always had cats at her farm.

She was an active member of the Bethany Price United Methodist Church. She was also a member of the Garden Club and the Queen Anne's County Historical Society. She was often a docent at Tucker House in Centreville.

Elizabeth is survived by two cousins, William and Eddie Helbeler both of Red

Bank, NJ; caregiver and friend, Anne Robinett of Centreville. She was predeceased by her husband Edwin Flower and a daughter Elizabeth S. Flower.

A memorial service will be at 11 am on Saturday, October 22, 2011 at Bethany Price United Methodist Church, Church Hill, MD. A visitation will be from 6 to 8 pm on Wednesday, October 19, 2011 at Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P. A. Centreville, MD.

Burial will be private.
