



Dr. Ellicott McConnell

April 4, 1924 - May 18, 2018

Easton:

Dr. Ellicott (Mac or Eck) McConnell died on May 18, 2018 at his home in Easton, Maryland following a short illness. He was 94 years old.

He was born in Providence, Rhode Island on March 4th, 1924. He was the son of Grace Main McConnell and Chrystie McConnell.

He was married to Harriett Louise Shea of Hartford, Connecticut on July 1st, 1950 in West Hartford, Connecticut. He graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1949 and obtained his Masters of Science and PhD in Entomology degrees from the University of Minnesota in 1957.

He lived overseas in Panama, Egypt and Ethiopia for over twenty years performing scientific research on tropical diseases where he became a specialist on African sleeping sickness. He returned to the US in March 1977 and worked at the Naval Research Center at the Bethesda Naval Hospital. He resided in Potomac, Maryland and then Great Falls, Virginia until 1986 when he moved to Easton.

He enjoyed traveling and journeyed to many countries in Europe, and Africa and traveled to Japan and Russia on cruises.

He was active at the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum as a docent, tour guide, and engine repair team member. He was involved with the Talbot County Humane Society for several years and was also active in the Memorial Hospital Auxiliaries for many years. He enjoyed shooting and was an avid member of the Choptank Muzzleloaders, and the Talbot County Gun Club,

participating in their black powder turkey shoots on many occasions, winning often enough that the younger shooters refused to give him any handicap! He was also an avid reader and enjoyed writing letters to the editor for the Star Democrat and Washington Post expressing opinions and counter arguments to issues of the day. He was a member of the Saint Andrews Society, the Easton Library Poetry reading group, the Great Decisions group, and the Isaac Walton League. He served in the Army Signal Corps during WWII while stationed in India and was a member of the Easton VFW, Post 5118.

He leaves behind his wife Harriett of 67 years, his sister Elizabeth (Kenneth deceased) Haddad, daughter Anne (Richard) Naber of Mt Morris, Michigan and son Craig (Kristina) of Chardon, Ohio.

A memorial service will be held on Monday, May 21, at 2 PM at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., 200 S. Harrison St., Easton, where friends may call one hour prior from 1-2 PM.
