



## Elmer Ernest Erhart

September 24, 1921 - February 4, 2012

Elmer E. Erhart of Centreville, MD, died Saturday February 4, 2012, at the age of 90 years old with his family at his bedside.

He was born on September 24, 1921, on a farm near Ingleside to Hungarian immigrants John and Giselle Erhart. Elmer served in WWII and was at Normandy on D-day. He was a member of the American Legion for 59 years. Elmer was married to the late Ann Roe Erhart for 60 years until her death in 2007. He was an electrician and enjoyed traveling, woodworking, gardening, and being in nature. Devoted to his daughters and grandchildren, he was a gentle and compassionate man.

Elmer was preceded in death by his parents and wife, brothers William, John, Albert, and George Erhart, and sister, Helen Reiter. He is survived by daughters, Rebecca Carter and Theresa Segal, both of Centreville; grandsons Brian Carter of Easton, Evan Segal of Englewood, CO; and granddaughters, Tracy Carter and Amy Segal, both of Centreville.

A funeral service will be at 11 a.m. on Friday, February 10 at FHN in Centreville with a visitation from 10-11 a.m. Following the service, Elmer will be buried with his wife at the Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery in Hurlock.
