Elizabeth Lynette King Bryan of Grasonville died on September 18, 2011. She was 97.

Born on February 14, 1914 in Winchester (Grasonville), MD the daughter of the late William E. King and Drucilla Collier King. Mrs. Bryan attended Grasonville Elementary School and Stevensville High School. In 1930, she married Frederick Kirby Bryan of Grasonville, MD. They made their home in Grasonville where she raised her family. Mrs. Bryan was a homemaker but did work a few years at the Perfect Garment Co. and as a waitress at both the Islander restaurant in Stevensville and the Circle Rest in Chester. Mrs. Bryan was very involved in her church, Immanuel United Methodist Church in Grasonville, MD.
