September 22, 1913 - September 14, 2008

Etta M. Clough of Centreville died Sunday, September 14, 2008 at Corsica Hills Nursing Home in Centreville, MD. She was 94.

Born September 22, 1913 in Centreville, MD, she was the daughter of the late, Eugene and Martha Delahay Clough. After graduating from Centreville High School in 1930 she received her ministerial training from God's Bible School in Cincinnati, OH and entered the Wesleyan Ministry. Miss Clough served various charges and was responsible for several church plantings during her career from 1937 - 1976 serving in Baltimore, MD, Wachapreague, VA; Gurtletree, VA; Quimby, VA; Wilimington, DE; Cape Charles, VA; Exmore, VA; and with her last being in Greenwood, DE. At that time she returned to Centreville, MD and during her retirement she volunteered at The Pines in Easton for 18 years and traveled to Guyanna, South Africa in children's ministry.

She enjoyed music, playing the piano, organ, accordion, trumpet, guitar and harpsichord. Miss Clough also wrote poetry and published a song book for children.

Miss Clough is survived by a sister, Margaret Lohr of Greensboro, MD; one niece, Margaret McCreary and two nephews, Winfield and Edward Lohr. She was predeceased by her brother, Thomas Clough and sister, Nellie Dorsey.

A funeral service will be held on Wednesday, September 17, 2008 at 1PM at the Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, PA in Centreville, MD where family and friends may call one hour before. Burial will follow in Chesterfield Cemetery in Centreville, MD.
